Dear Parent or Guardian:

The attached notice is one of several that all parents of students attending our school will receive regarding requirements of the federal *No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB)*. The notice informs you of your right to request the qualifications of your child's teachers. According to *NCLB*, you will be reminded of your right to request this information each school year. If you request this information, you will also be told about the qualifications of any paraprofessional who may be helping your child learn certain skills.

You are being given this notice because *NCLB* established a new definition of "highly qualified" for teachers of core academic subjects, which include English, reading/language arts, math, science, foreign language, social studies, art, music, and drama. All teachers of core academic subjects must have met the new federal requirement by the end of the 2005-2006 school year.

Our state has always been a leader in setting high standards for the licensing of teachers and our school district works hard to bring qualified, fully licensed teachers into our classrooms. *NCLB* gives you the "right to know" about the qualifications of your child's teachers and our school district has changed its requirements to meet the new federal definition.

Currently, our records indicate the following percentage of our teachers of core academic subjects meet the new definition for being "highly qualified":

100% Percentage of teachers highly qualified per *NCLB*

0% Percentage working toward meeting new qualifications.

I am confident in the ability of our faculty to provide the highest level of instruction for all students as we work toward implementing and attaining new federal and state requirements. As always, I appreciate and encourage your continued involvement at school and support of your child's education.

TITLE I – PARENTS’ RIGHT-TO-KNOW

September 1, 2015

Dear parent/guardian:

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act is our country’s most important federal Education law. In 2001 this law was reauthorized and is now called the *No Child Left Behind Act* (NCLB). NCLB was designed to make changes in teaching and learning that will help increase academic achievement in our schools.

The law requires that all schools receiving Title I funds must inform parents of their right to ask schools about the qualifications of their child’s teachers. Our school receives Title I funding and we are happy to share this information with you at your request.

We believe that nothing is more important to your child’s education at school than having a well-prepared and highly qualified teacher. The law requires that all teachers must meet a specific legal definition of “highly qualified” in order to teach in schools that receive Title I funding. The legal definition of a “highly qualified teacher” has three parts. It states that the teacher must have the following:

1. A four-year college degree
2. A regular teaching certificate/license
3. Proof of their knowledge in the subject they teach

New Jersey has some of the most qualified teachers in the country, and we are extremely proud of the quality of the teaching staff in the Cherry Hill Public School District. All teachers in our school district already meet this legal definition of highly qualified. All of our regular teachers have college degrees and many have advanced degrees. The state of New Jersey has always required a teaching certificate/license for all teachers. In addition, every teacher continues learning through professional development activities and our teachers are evaluated each year to make sure that their teaching skills remain at the highest possible level.

A highly qualified teacher knows what to teach, how to teach, and has a full understanding of the subject matter being taught. We believe that every teacher in our school is fully qualified and dedicated to teaching your child.

I encourage you to support your child’s education and communicate with your child’s teacher(s) on a regular basis.
